From the Director:

Dear Ashby,

At the time I'm writing this, it's mid-April, and the COA Budget for Fiscal Year 2020 still remains to be finalized by the Ashby Selectmen and Finance Committee. The two groups are meeting again next week to finalize the budget numbers. By the time you are reading this, we will all know whether the COA's efforts to increase our budget have been successful.

That being said, here's what I can tell you for sure: all of our work, meetings, lobbying, and discussions, have not been unfruitful. I have learned a lot during this budget-increaseprocess, namely: how the town of Ashby's budget process works, how reliant Ashby is on the volunteer-spirit of it's citizens to keep our town functioning, and the high level of dedication & commitment of those volunteers that serve on our committees and boards.

The COA and I have also learned that, at times, there is misunderstanding as to exactly what the Council On Aging does. It's our job to make sure the community and it's leaders are educated on the COA so everyone in Ashby can benefit from its services. To that end, here are the 4 defining elements of all COA's, that everyone needs to know:

- 1. COA's serve as an elder advocate and offer services and activities for seniors;
- 2. COA's provide local outreach, social and health services, advocacy, information, and referral for older adults, their families, and caregivers;
- 3. COA's serve as a link to support for seniors;
- 4. Each COA determines its own priorities based on local needs and resources;

Number 4 is worth highlighting, because it means that the Ashby COA must be what Ashby citizens want and need it to be. We need your feedback to make this work. Your COA members and I look forward to making the Ashby COA meet the needs of Ashby seniors now and in the future.



Ashby P.D. Tip of the Month: **PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK BOX**



Now that spring has officially arrived some of you may be in the mood to clean up the house a bit. If you are looking to get rid of any unused or expired medicine we want to offer you a safe and effective way to dispose of them. The Ashby Police Department offers a drug take back box for disposal of medications. The box is conveniently located in the lobby of the Ashby police station year round.

There are a few simple rules to remember when dropping your medicine in our drug take back box: We do not accept any

needles, liquids, or aerosols (inhalers) in this container. We also ask that you place all your pills in a Ziploc bag. This saves space from the bulky packaging of pill boards and pill bottles. You can then dispose of your empty pill bottles and boards with your normal trash. If you do have any needles that need to be disposed we have a separate container to accept these items. Worcester shuttle leaves at 7:30am, 11:30am and 3:30pm. Cost is \$8.00 one way with Mart ID. Boston shuttle leaves at 7:30am, Noon and 3:00pm. Cost is \$10.00 one way with Mart ID.
