You will need to bring income, utility and residence verification as well as an ID. Eligibility is based on the size of the household and the combined gross income of its members. 

More Assistance

NEW HOUSING REHAB AND FUEL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

A 15-year, deferred payment and interest free loan - decreasing 5%/year. If you continue to live in and own your home for 15 years, you owe nothing! The intention of this program is to assist low and moderate income residents to improve their housing situation. Examples of eligible improvements include: Repair or replacement of roofs, windows, doors; Upgrade to heating, plumbing and electrical systems; Structural repairs; Repair or replacement of septic systems; Addressing energy efficiency issues.

As long as you own your home, this is an interest free loan, based on a 15 year forgiveness schedule. It decreases 5% per year up to 15 years and then you owe nothing.

Funds for Ashbu aare limited to no more than 5 households for Housing Rehab assistance and no more than 18 households for fuel assistance.

How to Apply:

Applications are accepted in person or by mail at the Town Clerk's Office, 895 Main St. Ashby, MA 01431 or MRPC, 1427 R Water Street, Fitchburg, MA 01420.

Income information is confidential and will only be viewed by MRPC staff, who will determine eligibility. Income guidelines vary depending on household size. The property must be located in Ashby and be occupied primarily by households that meet the income guidelines. Please note that Household Size includes all persons living in the home or owner occupied apartment unit. The income limits include all income earned by household members.

The fuel assistance program is lot simpler. The homeowner, if eligible for LIHEAP through the Farm Workers Council, uses that benefit first. Then they may also use this additional benefit, which runs through September of next year, long after the LIHEAP benefit ends. You don't need to schedule an intake for fuel assistance, that application can be done over the phone and by mail. Fuels covered are oil and propane.
